

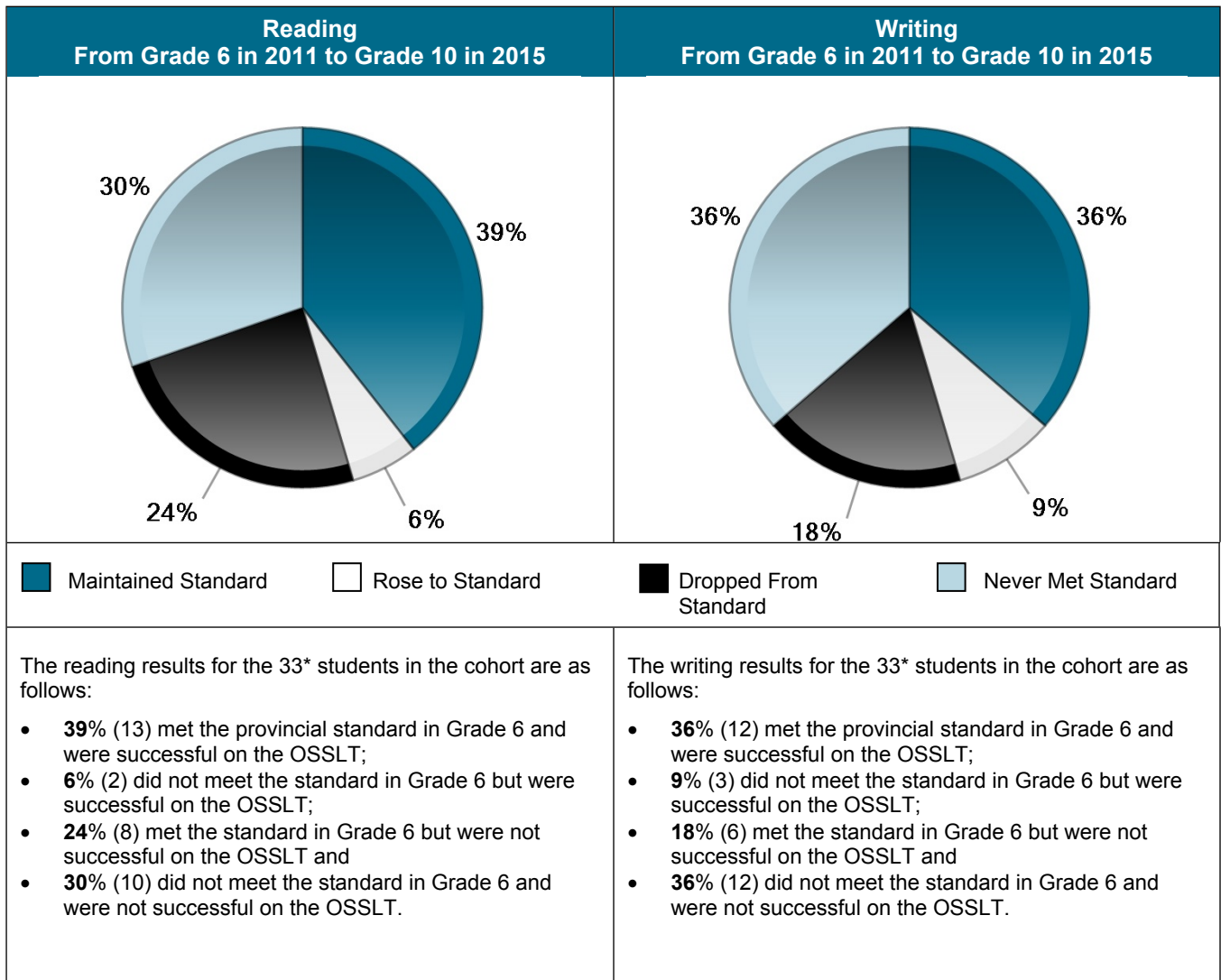


Tracking Student Achievement in Relation to the Provincial Standard Junior Division (Grade 6) in 2010–2011 to OSSLT (Fully Participating) in 2014–2015

EQAO tracked the progress of students who wrote the junior-division assessment in 2011, when they were in Grade 6, and the OSSLT in 2015, when they were in Grade 10. The pie charts below show how students performed on the 2015 test compared to their Grade 6 assessment results in 2011. The percentages are based on the number of tracked students in the cohort who participated in the OSSLT and for whom EQAO has Grade 6 results (including those who participated, those who were exempted and those who provided no work to be scored in Grade 6).
